Why Monika Enterprise instead of 'Monika Records?' It sounds so serious. Gudrun Gut: It's not so serious for us in Germany. We had a really cool television series called *Raumschiff Enterprise*, like the Starship Enterprise. That is where I took it from. I think an enterprise is something exciting, something (where) you don't know how it will end. It's an experience.

IS THERE ACTUALLY A PERSON NAMED MONIKA?

GG: It's a fish! Seriously, I had a goldfish called Monika. But she committed suicide, sadly. But now she lives again!

HOW DIFFERENT IS RUNNING A LABEL AND PLAYING MUSIC FOR YOU?

GG: Well, after years of having the life of an artist, with all its instabilities, it was quite relaxing for me to have a 'normal' thing—to work at daytime and have an office, et cetera. But I really didn't expect it to be so much work to run a label. It's endless but it's rewarding as well, and it always has to do with music that I like. All the Monika releases somehow have to do with my dreams and visions, without me having created them.

IS IT JUST AS SATISFYING AS MAKING YOUR OWN MUSIC?

66: I guess. It's a yes and it's a no. Both making music and label work can be pretty depressing.

HOW DO YOU PICK YOUR ROSTER OF ARTISTS?

GG: It takes long for me to sign an artist. They are all original artists that have impressed and entertained me, and that I feel add something to the scene. They all have something to say. Basically, no copycats. I need each release to stand on its own and represent an important step forward. Monika is not really a genre label—we are interested in artists. Monika puts a light on them and lets them shine like sparkling stars. Like now I just saw this fantastic Australian drummer named Laurenz Pike. We have a 10" coming out with a nine minute drum solo by him. Maybe that's not commercial thinking, but I love to hear stuff like this! Who brings out a nine minute drum solo nowadays? Monika!



WITH THE EXCEPTION OF A FEW ARTISTS HERE AND THERE, MONIKA HAS A VERY FEMINIST FEEL TO IT. WOULD YOU RATHER ONLY SIGN FEMALE ELECTRONIC MUSICIANS?

GG: No way! I'm trying to have a good mixture of male and female. Maybe a bit more female, but look at other labels! They only have male music!

That is the problem!

YES, IT IS A PROBLEM. HOW DO YOU FEEL THAT WOMEN HAVE CHANGED THE LANDSCAPE OF ELECTRONIC MUSIC?

GG: Since I have a weekly radio show, I don't have to feel it. I can see it in their releases. Unfortunately, there are not so many! If you see it as a landscape, we are the colorful flowers out there.

DO YOU EVER FEEL PIGEONHOLED BY THE FACT THAT PEOPLE ASSOCIATE YOUR LABEL WITH FEMINISM?

GG: What's a pigeonhole? The dick in your hand is better than the pigeon on the roof?

GG: God. Listen. Yes, I'm always interested in the female voice in music, and yes I do listen more carefully there. Since pop music is one of the main guides of our social life and personality, I think it's just fair and pretty necessary to have an equal male/female ranking. I don't really want to start the argument that 'female music is different from male.' It really doesn't matter as long as we can hear the female voice.

UNDERSTOOD.

GG: We now started the series '4 Women No Cry,' which is about female artists/composers/performers in the field of electronics and songwriting from all over the world. (The idea is) to introduce them to listeners who would not buy a whole album of a new artist, but would maybe invest the money to get to know four new artists. And you know, to tell you the truth, nobody really associates Monika as a feminist label! Monika is associated over here as a small but high quality indie/electronic label.

I'M SORRY FOR EVER SAYING THAT. SO WHAT IS THE FUTURE OF YOUR LABEL?

GG: Guess what? I am German, and we want Monika world domination!
